Area Prescription Assistance Resources

McKee Medical Center Prescription Assistance Program: 635-4017

For patients that live in surrounding Loveland area and have a local physician. Patients will be screened to meet the low-income guideline. Vouchers and drug manufacture applications are available for chronic routine medications. Staff will evaluate for Medicare D Drug Plans and Social Security "Extra Help" financial assistance.

Loveland Community Health Clinic: 669-4855 • Pharmacy: 461-3843

To participate, patients need to be established as a patient in the clinic. They use CICIP fees and discounts with medications and office visits. They have a pharmacy on site for clients' prescriptions.

House of Neighborly Services: 667-4939

For Loveland /Berthoud residents within Thompson R2J school district. They able to help with emergency prescription assistance on a case by case basis, usually helping with vouchers for two prescriptions or up to \$100 cost. Proof of income, social security card and local address required. Hours are Monday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Larimer Center for Mental Health: Loveland 613-4471 • Fort Collins 498-7612

Help with mental health prescriptions. (You need to be a patient there to be eligible for aid.)

Children's Health Plan Plus: 1-800-359-1991

Children under 18 who are not eligible for Medicaid or private insurance can apply and receive health coverage and prescription benefits. Cost is sliding fee.

Generics

Available for anyone at Wal-Mart, Target, Kmart, King Soopers and Safeway. \$4 to \$15 generics.

Free Rx Discount Cards

Larimer County Medical Society and Larimer County Commissioners provide prescription discounts at our local pharmacies. 15-46 percent discounts. Obtain card online or at local agencies including McKee Prescription Assistance, Health District of Northern Larimer, Catholic Charities, House of Neighborly Services, 211 and others.

Larimer County VA Clinic: Fort Collins 224-1550

They help veterans with affording medications that are prescribed by one of their clinic doctors. VA hospitals are located in Cheyenne, Wyo., or Denver. Transportation to some area hospitals is available.

Larimer County Human Services: 679-4451 or 498-6800

Person with limited income should contact Human Services to determine if they may be eligible for Medicaid benefits, disability, food stamps, subsidized housing or LEAP for utilities.

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Catholic Charities Northern Larimer: 484-5010

Open Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 1 to 4 p.m. Will assist with short term emergency needs.

Health District of Northern Larimer County, Fort Collins: 416-6519

Prescription assistance for low income and uninsured clients in Fort Collins areas. They help provide vouchers and manufacturer assistance applications with drug companies for routine chronic meds.

Salud Family Health Center, Fort Collins: 494-4040

Serving all patients as primary health care services, CICIP discounted fees. Order discounted medications with the center's pharmacy

NCMC Prescription Assistance Program, Greeley: 378-4314

Program is for patients that utilize Banner Health services and live in surrounding Greeley areas. Persons need to be screened and meet financial guidelines to determine if eligible for manufacture assistance applications or vouchers. Will evaluate for the Medicare Plan D drug plan/Social Security Extra Help Program.

NCMC Behavioral Health Program, Greeley: 1-800-882-8297

Call for free assessment, then meet with Psych MD, RN, review medication list. Fee of \$20 per session. Medication samples if available.

North Range Behavioral Health (Psych Meds): 353-3686

Individual must be client of NRBH. Some samples for psych meds may be available.

Sunrise Community Clinic, 2930 11th Ave., Greeley: 353-9403

King Sooper's Pharmacy at Sunrise Medication Assistance, Greeley: 395-9011

Individual must be a patient there to be eligible for help with medications. They provide primary care and other routine health care, dental care and use CICIP guidelines for sliding fee payments.

Weld County Social Services , Greeley: 352-1551

Individuals with limited incomes should contact DSS to determine if they may be eligible for programs connected with MEDICAID or any other benefits to provide financial assistance (subsidized housing, LEAP for utilities, etc.).

Weld County VA Clinic, Greeley: 1-888-481-4065

They help Veterans with prescriptions prescribed by one of their clinic doctors. Other VA sites are in Fort Collins, Cheyenne and Denver. Transportation by van is available to some area clinics.

Catholic Charities Northern Weld: 353-6433

Open Monday through Friday from 1 to 4 p.m. Individuals must complete an application showing need for medication assistance. (Funding limited to per year per individual.)

Colorado State University Hartshorn Health Services, Fort Collins: 491-1734

CSU students only, prescriptions written by their doctors. Some samples are available. Small fee with sliding scale
