Who we are:

Meds Connection is a new program, provided by the nonprofit Banner Health, developed to help people with Parkinson's disease obtain free or low cost medication. The program serves all Arizona residents and is offered at no cost to individuals.

What we do:

Today, more than ever, people are struggling to cope with the rising costs of prescription medication. This can be a particular challenge for those who have been diagnosed with a chronic illness, such as Parkinson's disease. Medication costs can be unrelenting and for those with little or no drug coverage, unaffordable.

Help does exist. At Banner Meds Connection, trained staff provides assistance for people who are struggling to afford prescription medications. Our comprehensive program utilizes established methods to secure low cost or free medications from sources such as pharmaceutical companies. Individuals are able to apply for Meds Connection either in person or over the phone.

Our process includes:

- Information about programs offered
- A personal review of medication needs
- Determination of eligibility
- Help compiling financial documents and required paperwork
- Direct assistance in completing application process
- Quick access to medications
- Follow-up for renewal
