RISK INFORMATION FOR GENTAMICIN INJECTION □ Right □ Left

The following are possible complications and risks associated with these procedures. In addition, all surgical procedures incur the risks of anesthesia, bleeding, wound infections, cosmetic deformity, scars, and unforeseen/uncommon complications.

Vertigo is expected 1-7 days after injection and may be severe.

Hearing loss occurs in up to 20% of patients. This may be permanent and irreversible.

Reinjection with gentamicin may be necessary if the current injection is not completely effective. On average, 2-3 injections are needed.

An **allergic reaction** to the antibiotic is rare but is also a possible complication.

Persistent unsteadiness may occur in up to 10% of patients.

My physician and his staff have made themselves available to answer my questions. I have read, understand, and carefully considered the risks and complications of this surgery, and I accept them.
