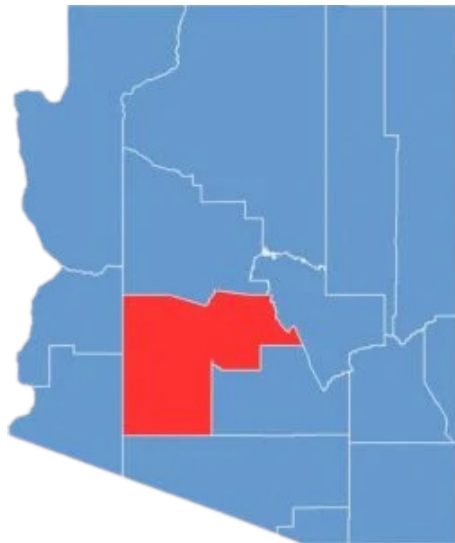

Total Cases: **2,678**

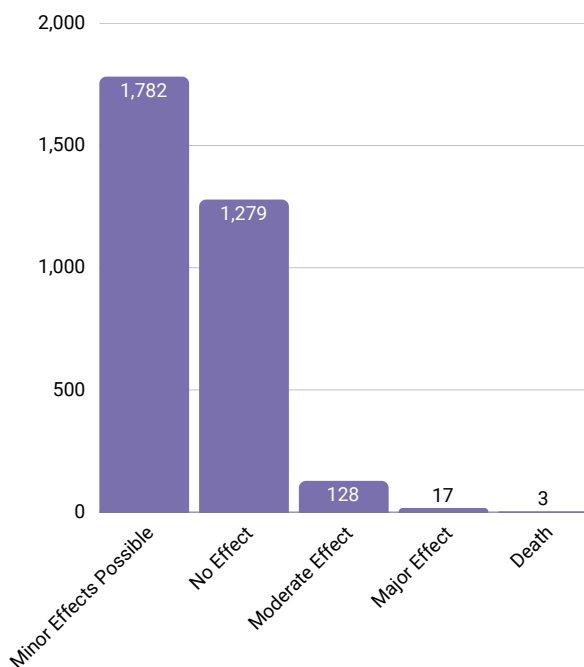
*Information Cases: **422**

Medical Outcome for Exposure Cases



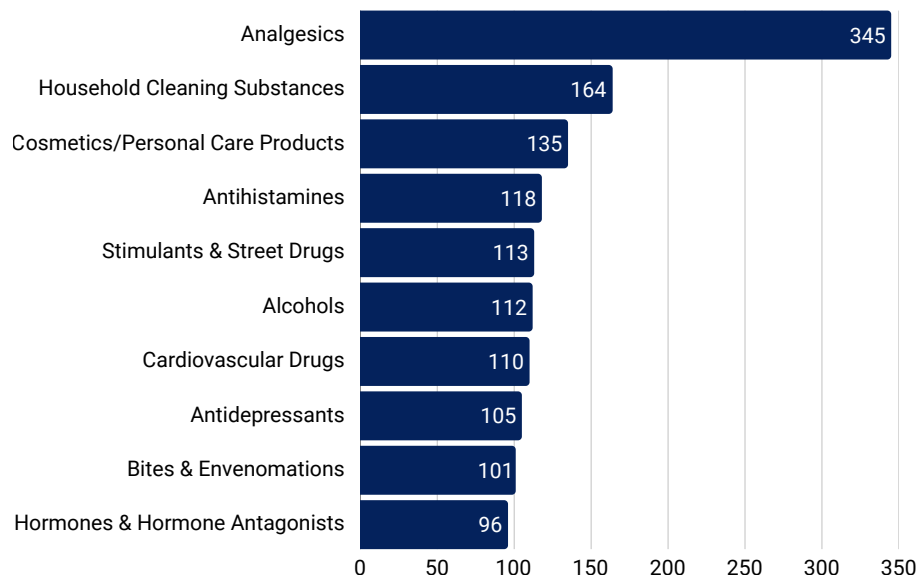
The majority of January exposure cases had minor effects. A total of 17 cases in Maricopa County resulted in major patient effects.

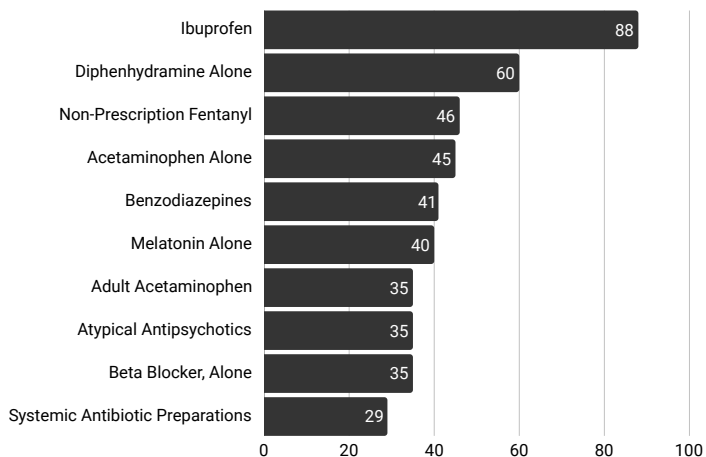

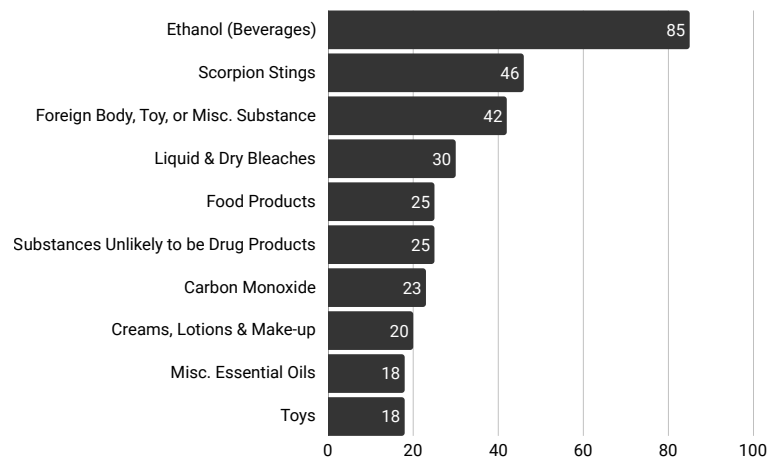
Top 10 Exposure Categories- Jan. 2026

Top 10 Exposure Substances- Non-drug Category

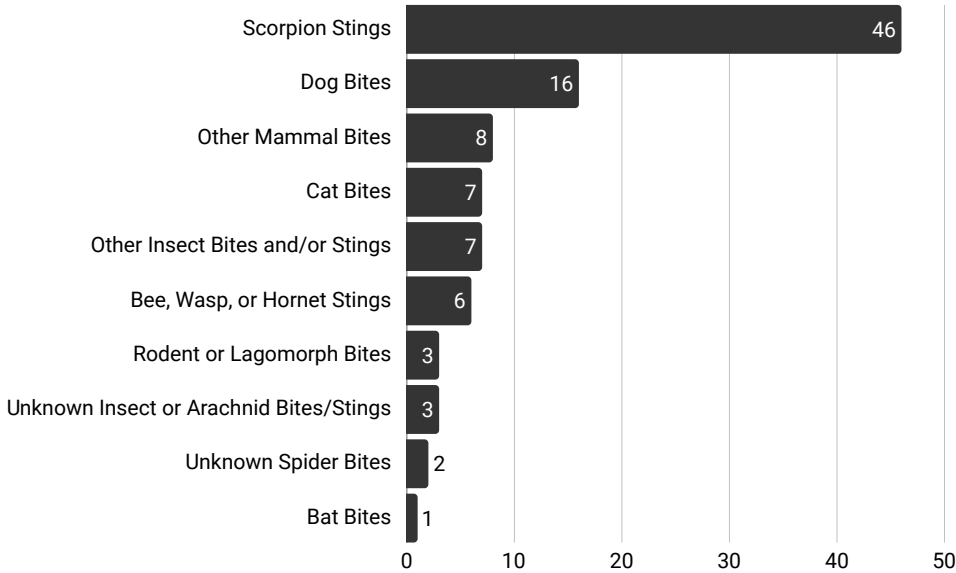

Bites & Stings

Residing in the venom capital of the US, the Banner Poison Center manages thousands of envenomation cases per year. A majority of these envenomations are scorpion stings, which increase in the warmer months, although cases are reported throughout the entire year.

Top 10 Bites & Stings Cases- January 2026



With the help of epidemiologists at the Maricopa County Health Department, specially trained poison center nurses will advise patients that have experienced mammalian bites on whether rabies treatment is necessary.

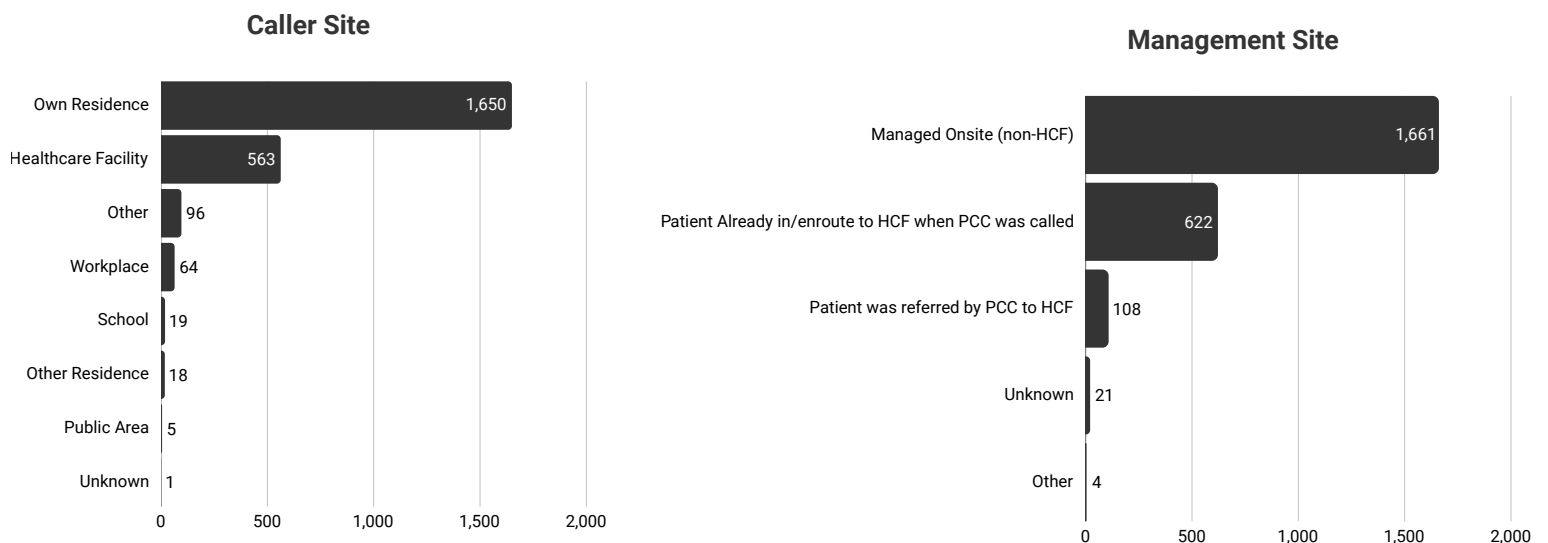
In January 2026, BPDIC had zero rattlesnake bite cases reported.

JANUARY 2026

Caller & Management Site

Most calls come in from a place of residence. Calling poison control saves patients time and money, as most non-emergency poisoning cases can be treated at home.

Poison control experts can advise patients on whether they need to visit a healthcare facility and will follow-up with patients until cases are closed.

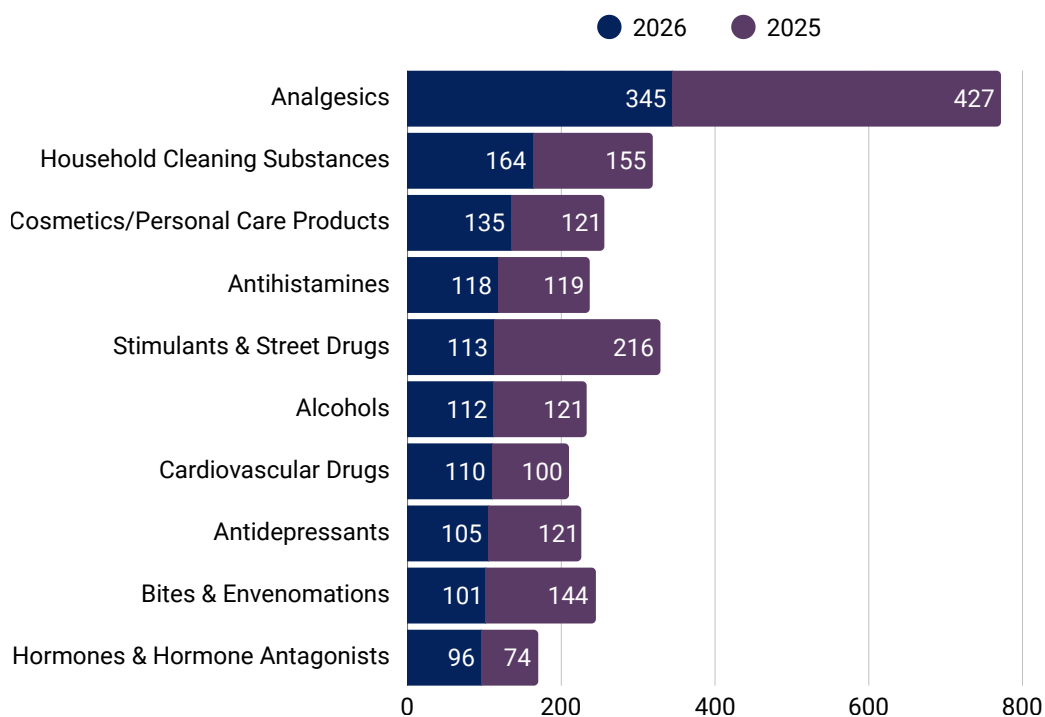


In January, 68.75% of cases were managed onsite (non-healthcare facility), with 90.6% of those cases being at a caller's own residence.

Exposure Statistics- 2025 vs. 2026

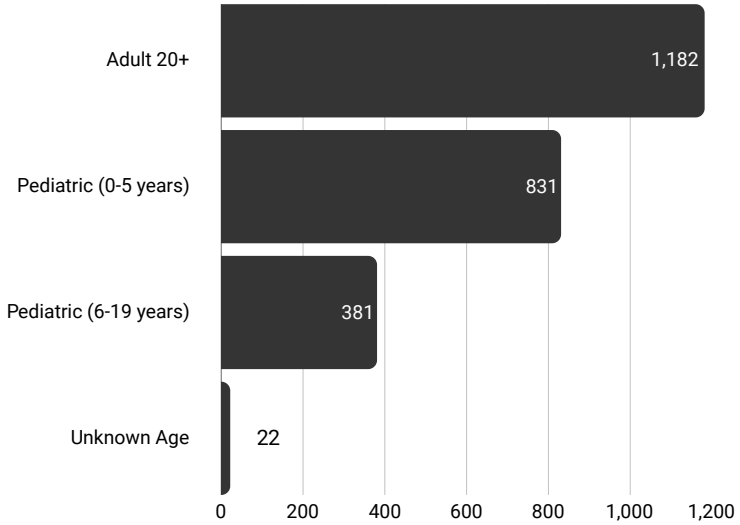
Top 10 Exposure Categories- Jan. 2026 vs. Jan 2025

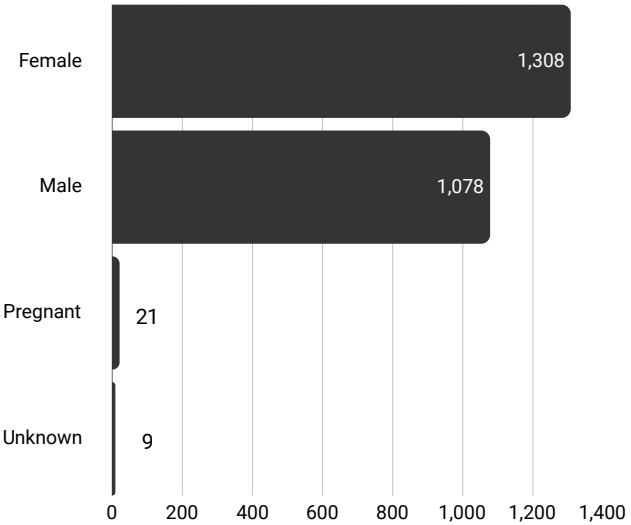
Exposures by Age & Gender

Adults at 20 years of age and above accounted for nearly half of all exposure cases in January, sitting at 48.9%.

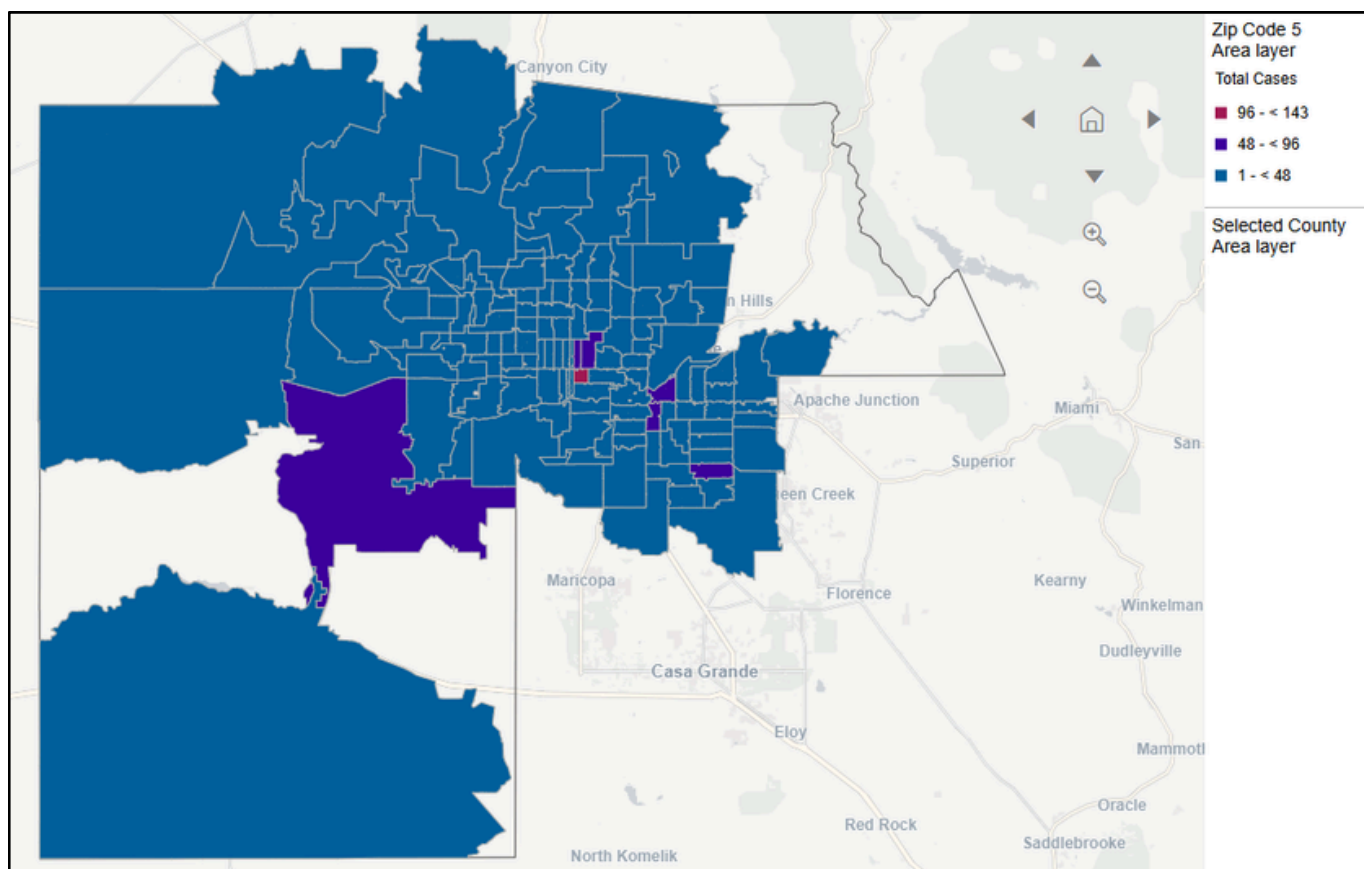
Human Exposures by Gender



There was a female predominance in human exposure cases for the month of January, with female exposure cases accounting for 54.1% of all cases.
